TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP

Active members receive an identification badge and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)/gear, and are allowed to participate in the full range of activities within their professional roles. Membership renewal is not automatic; rather, it is based on continued active participation and membership in good standing.

Inactive members that would like to be considered part of the group, but professional or personal obligations do not allow them to actively participate in all meetings and events.

All members (active and inactive) are eligible for meeting attendance, training programs, and basic correspondence.

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HISTORY OF THE NCMRC

The Natrona County MRC (NCMRC) was founded in October 2005 in response to a fire at a local restaurant, as every ambulance in Natrona County was taking calls, and none were available to standby for firefighter rehabilitation, thus the NCMRC was born. The NCMRC has evolved throughout the years and now provides first aid booths at community events, provides personnel to staff a volunteer reception center if the county needs to process volunteers in the time of a disaster, and instructs first-aid and CPR classes.
